




London college students and disadvantage 2013-14 cohort (the last cohort progressing in 2014-15)

Three in four Level 3 FE students dassified as living in an area of disadvantage using Income Deprivation affecting Children Index (IDACI Q1/Q2)












Degree classification of London college students entering degree programmes in 2012-2013
